

The UC Class of 1920 bench commemorates the heroism of the men at the University who died in combat during World War I.

The marble bench includes two small sculptures of mourning bears and sits outside the entrance to the Campanile.

Tours start at 10:00 am and end at approximately 12:00 noon. Sometimes they are slightly longer, so some extra time should be allowed in case the walk meets an informative passerby or dwells at an interesting site. Tours are limited to 30 paying participants unless noted otherwise. Pre-paid reservations are required and tickets are not refundable. Tours are conducted in rain, shine or Berkeley fog and are wheelchair accessible unless otherwise noted.

Keep a record of your order. E-mail addresses and telephone numbers are very important for last-minute changes and confirmations. You will be sent an e-mail or we will phone confirmations with starting points.

For last-minute reservations, call 510-848-0181 between 1 and 4 pm on the Thursday or Friday before the tour to learn the meeting place and sign up if there is an opening. The BHS, a volunteer organization, appreciates your support.

FALL 2019 WALKING TOURS

Saturday, September 21: *South Shattuck Avenue.* Led by Robert Johnson

As a stop on the early train, the area around Dwight Way became a commercial node, but as downtown became the commercial center the lack of new development actually helped preserve some elements of the area. A mix of important old and new buildings, the area also has features of the Japanese American presence, the former Herrick Hospital, the former Berkeley Free Market, the location of the Fine Arts Cinema and a rich variety of architecture.

Saturday, October 5: *Mountain View Cemetery.* Led by Dennis Evanosky

A walking tour of one of the first cemeteries in the East Bay. Many early prominent Berkeley citizens are interred there as Berkeley has no cemeteries. The extensive grounds are on a hilly area with spectacular monuments and views. Not wheelchair accessible.

Saturday, October 12: *On the Berkeley Waterfront.* Led by John Underhill

Visit the current waterfront, seen with 150 years as background. Visit Shorebird Nature Center, ship chandlery, the Berkeley Yacht Club and the concrete submarine. Extended flat walking.

Saturday, October 19: *West Berkeley Artisans and Industries.* Led by Jana Olson

A walking tour showing examples of artisans and industries operating in the southwest Berkeley area west of San Pablo Avenue between Dwight Way and Ashby Avenue. Some sites not wheelchair accessible.

Saturday, October 26: *Berkeley Sites and Memories of War.* Led by Steven Finacom

Though Berkeley regards itself as a city of peace, it has also been shaped by war in many ways. As Armistice/Veterans Day approaches, this walk will visit local sites connected to war including some of the nearly dozen veterans memorials on the UC Berkeley campus and the city's cluster of Downtown military monuments and buildings where "Homefront" activities took place during World Wars I and II. The walk will also include sites where the actions of Berkeleyans had an international effect on both war and peace. The walk will be mostly downhill on campus pathways and city sidewalks.
